## **SERMON NOTES**

Saturday/Sunday, October 19/20, 2024 – Pastor Kischnick <u>THEME</u>: "Content and Thankful" <u>TEXT</u>: Ecclesiastes 5:10-20 <u>INTRO</u>. "Bargain Mansions" – couple w/ beautiful house, <u>8 years old</u>. "It's a little dated." Unhappy w/ floors, landscaping, counters, laundry room, etc. \$550k budget. <u>8 yrs. old!</u> Unhappy, dissatisfied, discontented! <u>TEXT</u>: The Preacher (Solomon) sees an evil on display/experienced: if one <u>loves</u> wealth, one is *never* satisfied. Only one path to contentment: a relationship with God through Christ Jesus.

## I. THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN NEEDS AND WANTS

<u>ILLUST</u>. Pioneers could fit all the <u>needed</u> into one wagon: clothes, tools, pot & pans, plow. Becky and I would need a whole moving truck to move.

- A. Most of us have all we physically need.
  - 1. God has provided. 2. Most needs are affordable, even if used.
  - 3. In addition, God in Christ has seen to our spiritual needs.
- B. We also have wants large and small.
  - 1. God provides many of these as well.
  - 2. Many are "short-term", soon unused, forgotten, stock-piled.
- C. There is no sin in either of these UNLESS:

## II. WE FALL IN LOVE WITH WEALTH

- A. The Preacher see a Great Evil:
  - 1. "...wealth hoarded to the harm of its owners..."
  - 2. "hoarded" selfishness, embrace it, "feast their eyes on it"
  - 3. "the harm" = hardened hearts, self-sufficiency, "What God?"
  - 4. Idea: "I must deserve this God must be happy with me!"
- B. A Second Evil: We cannot take it with us!
  - 1. People pile it up to what end?

<u>ILLUST</u>. Article: baby-boomers have so much stuff, they leave it all to children/grandchildren who have no use for most of it. Then what?

2. "A loose hold on physical things enables a firmer hold on Christ and his kingdom."

## **III. ONE PATH TO CONTENTMENT: JESUS**

- A. The eye of a needle: impossible without God.
- B. Formula for contentment: God + the Basics
  - 1. Hold on to Jesus and his righteousness. 2. Needs met.
- 3. Family, friends, church. 4. Generosity and Compassion.
- C. THANKSGIVING: credit where credit is due for phys. & spiritual <u>CLOSE</u>: Christian financier dies, one request = 2 suitcases, Peter-OK. In heaven, angel guides to abode, asks: "What's in cases?" Opens > gold! "Pavement?" Wealth can do good, but "loved" it does evil. JESUS only!
