



LWML Kentuckiana Women in Mission Spring Meeting

All ladies of Grace are welcome to this event hosted by Grace Lutheran on **SATURDAY**, **MAY 18 IN THE FIRESIDE ROOM.** We begin at 9:00 with a time of fellowship, coffee, breakfast sweets and fruit.

Registration for the day is \$10.00. Lunch is being served.

The theme is "<u>Connected in Christ</u>." Based on John 5:15, "I am the vine; you are the branches. If a man remains in me and I in him, he will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing."

There will be a morning devotion, followed by a Bible study led by zone counselor Pastor Andrew Becker, Pastor at Shepherd of the Hills, Georgetown. The speaker will be Monica Ochola, sharing her work with Hope for the Destitute. Hope for the Destitute is a nonprofit organization in Kisumu, Kenya that provides educational support for orphaned children and shelter for needy widows. Many children are orphaned in this country and are left in the care of elderly relatives who have no source of income. Education is not free in Kenya, and many students are unable to access it. Hope for the Destitute ensures that orphaned children can access education as well as be nurtured spiritually in Lutheran teachings and devotions.

There will be an offering for Hope for the Destitute. The ingathering for the day is material and thread for Fabric Kits for Lutheran World Relief. (See Fabric Kits for specific instructions.) The day will end at 1:30 pm.



The LWML is collecting material and thread for FABRIC KITS for Lutheran World Relief.

If you would like to donate any material or thread, please put material or thread in the basket on top of God's Post Office in the hallway across from the mailboxes.

Recent fabric kits have been sent to Burkina Faso where the fabric and thread are used to mend clothing and extend the life of the peoples limited wardrobes. In Mali, vocational centers instruct young women and girls to sew as a means of earning an income for themselves and their families.

Items Needed:

TWO spools of neutral-colored, general-purpose

thread, 250-300 yards each

<u>TWO pieces of cotton or cotton-blend fabric (no knits of 100% polyester).</u>

Each piece should match one of the sizes below:

- 2 ¼ yards of 60" wide fabric
- 3 yards of 44" wide fabric
- 4 yards of 36" wide fabric

IMPORTANT GUIDELINES

- Fabric should have no stains or holes.
- Pieces do not need to match in size or color/pattern as long as they fit into one of the three size options.
- Each spool of thread should match one of the pieces of fabric included. Neutral thread is also a good option.
- Please give new items only.
- Please do not donate items with any religious symbols, messages, or your group's name.
- Please do not donate any items decorated with a U.S. flag, patriotic or military symbols, or references to the armed forces, including camouflage.


