GREETINGS AND PRAYER

HYMN: LSB 483 With High Delight Let Us Unite

(Please rise) **CALL to WORSHIP** Shout for joy to the Lord, all the earth. Pastor: People: Serve the Lord with gladness; come before Him with joyful songs. Know that the Lord is God. Pastor: People: It is He who made us, and we are His; we are His people, the sheep of his pasture. Enter his gates with thanksgiving and his courts with praise; Pastor: People: Give thanks to Him and praise His name. Pastor: For the Lord is good and his love endures forever; People: His faithfulness continues through all generations. Pastor: Let us worship in the name of the Father, People: Who has created us, now sustains us, and has seen to our salvation. And in the name of the Son. Pastor: Who has saved us by His blood and thrilled us by His Resurrection from the dead. People: Pastor: And in the name of the Holy Spirit, People: Who has brought us to faith and poured out on us His gifts. Pastor: Oh, come, let us sing to the Lord;

People: Let us make a joyful noise to the rock of our salvation.

CONFESSION and ABSOLUTION:

Pastor: While we rightly acknowledge the Lord is great and most worthy of praise, we must also acknowledge our rebellion against him and our failure to keep his will. For if we claim we have no sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us.

People: But if we confess our sins, God, who is faithful and just, will forgive our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

People: Most merciful Father, we confess that we are by nature sinful and unclean, and that we daily sin against you in thought, word, and deed. We sin by the things we do, and by the things we leave undone. We have not loved you with our whole heart, nor have we loved our neighbors as ourselves. We justly deserve your punishments now and in

eternity. But, for the sake of your Son, Jesus Christ, have mercy on us. Forgive us, renew us, and lead us, so that we may delight in your will and walk in your ways to the glory of your holy name. Amen.

The FIRST READING: ACTS 8:26-40 [Philip uses the Scriptures to show Jesus to the Ethiopian.]

²⁶ Now an angel of the Lord said to Philip, "Go south to the road—the desert road—that goes down from Jerusalem to Gaza." ²⁷ So he started out, and on his way he met an Ethiopian^[a] eunuch, an important official in charge of all the treasury of the Kandake (which means "queen of the Ethiopians"). This man had gone to Jerusalem to worship, ²⁸ and on his way home was sitting in his chariot reading the Book of Isaiah the prophet. ²⁹ The Spirit told Philip, "Go to that chariot and stay near it." ³⁰ Then Philip ran up to the chariot and heard the man reading Isaiah the prophet. "Do you understand what you are reading?" Philip asked. ³¹ "How can I," he said, "unless someone explains it to me?" So he invited Philip to come up and sit with him. ³² This is the passage of Scripture the eunuch was reading: "He was led like a sheep to the slaughter, and as a lamb before its shearer is silent, so he did not open his mouth. ³³ In his humiliation he was deprived of justice. Who can speak of his descendants? For his life was taken from the earth." ³⁴ The eunuch asked Philip, "Tell me, please, who is the prophet talking about, himself or someone else?" ³⁵ Then Philip began with that very passage of Scripture and told him the good news about Jesus. ³⁶ As they traveled along the road, they came to some water and the eunuch said, "Look, here is water. What can stand in the way of my being baptized?" ^{(37]} ³⁸ And he gave orders to stop the chariot. Then both Philip and the eunuch went down into the water and Philip baptized him. ³⁹ When they came up out of the water, the Spirit of the Lord suddenly took Philip about, preaching the gospel in all the towns until he reached Caesarea.

Pastor: This is the Word of the Lord. People: Thanks be to God.

The SECOND READING: 1 JOHN 4:1-11 ["...test the spirits to see whether they are from God..."]

¹Dear friends, do not believe every spirit, but test the spirits to see whether they are from God, because many false prophets have gone out into the world. ² This is how you can recognize the Spirit of God: Every spirit that acknowledges that Jesus Christ has come in the flesh is from God, ³ but every spirit that does not acknowledge Jesus is not from God. This is the spirit of the antichrist, which you have heard is coming and even now is already in the world. ⁴ You, dear children, are from God and have overcome them, because the one who is in you is greater than the one who is in the world. ⁵ They are from the world and therefore speak from the viewpoint of the world, and the world listens to them. ⁶ We are from God, and whoever knows God listens to us; but whoever is not from God does not listen to us. This is how we recognize the Spirit of truth and the spirit of falsehood. ⁷ Dear friends, let us love one another, for love comes from God. Everyone who loves has been born of God and knows God. ⁸ Whoever does not love does not know God, because God is love. ⁹ This is how God showed his love among us: He sent his one and only Son into the world that we might live through him. ¹⁰ This is love: not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins. ¹¹ Dear friends, since God so loved us, we also ought to love one another.

Pastor: This is the Word of the Lord. People: Thanks be to God.

(Please stand) The GOSPEL HYMN: Before the Throne of God Above

The HOLY GOSPEL: JOHN 15:1-8 ["I am the vine; you are the branches."]

Pastor: The Gospel according to St. John, the 15th chapter.

People: Glory to You, O Lord.

(Please be seated)

"I am the true vine, and my Father is the gardener. ² He cuts off every branch in me that bears no fruit, while every branch that does bear fruit he prunes so that it will be even more fruitful. ³ You are already clean because of the word I have spoken to you. ⁴ Remain in me, as I also remain in you. No branch can bear fruit by itself; it must remain in the vine. Neither can you bear fruit unless you remain in me. ⁵ "I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing. ⁶ If you do not remain in me, you are like a branch that is thrown away and withers; such branches are picked up, thrown into the fire and burned. ⁷ If you remain in me and my words remain in you, ask whatever

you wish, and it will be done for you. ⁸ This is to my Father's glory, that you bear much fruit, showing yourselves to be my disciples.
